Overview of the ELCP program

Niagara College's (NC) English Language and Culture Program (ELCP) 2025 offers an exciting opportunity to learn to communicate in English through academic classes, field trips and social activities.

The Summer ELCP is made for students who want to learn English while getting to know more about Canadian culture in a fun and engaging way! Through the ELCP, students will engage with English speakers in common conversations. This program develops speaking accuracy and fluency by focusing on vocabulary building, conversational grammar, pronunciation, English idioms and everyday expressions.

As Niagara College is an adult learning environment, the minimum age requirement to participate in this program is 16 years old.

Program Goals

- Students will strengthen their general English skills, with a focus on speaking, listening, and pronunciation.
- Students will gain exposure to postsecondary education in an international context.
- Students will develop cross-cultural relationships in a multicultural setting.
- Students will have a memorable learning experience and forge long lasting friendships.

Homestay Program

The Homestay Program includes welcoming students into Canadian homes. It is a housing program with emphasis on a first-hand introduction to Canadian culture and the Niagara Region. Wonderful local families provide support and assistance while students adapt to the lifestyle and demands of learning a second language.



*Note, students have access to laundry facilities in the homestay program.

**Note, linens (bedding and towels) and basic toiletries are provided in the homestay program.

Important Points About the Homestay Program:

- A homestay family is as important to a student's experience as their classes.
- Homestay families are as diverse as the international students who attend Niagara College and have the desire to contribute to the lives of others.
- Most of our homestays are within close walking distance (10-20 minutes) of the College, and many families provide bicycles for the students, depending on the arrival date/season.
- Three nutritious meals a day are included for added convenience.

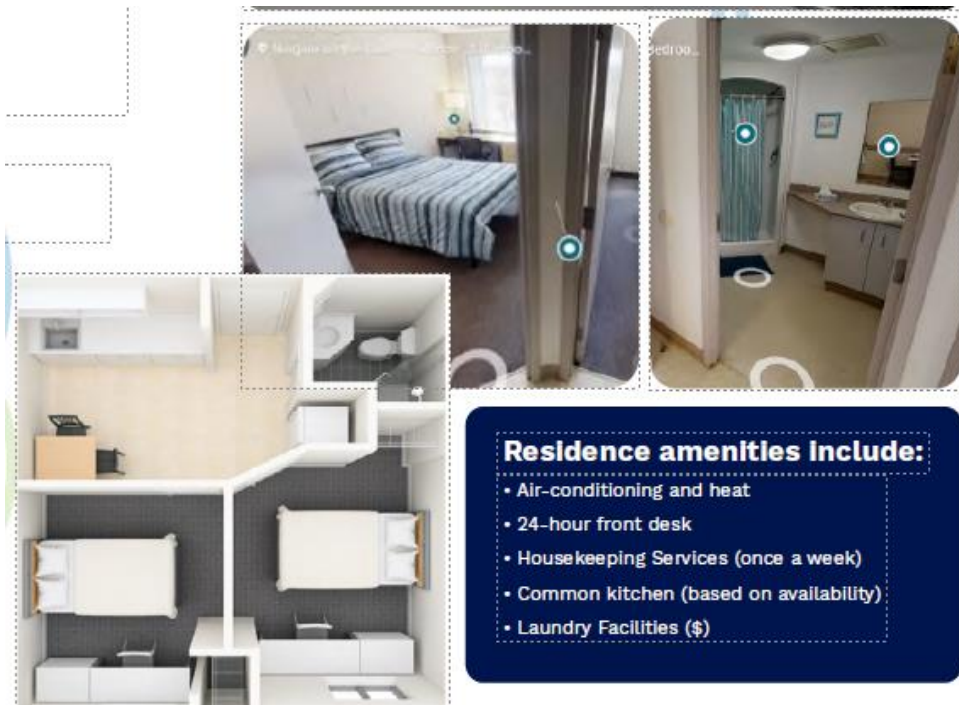

This homestay application form is for students to complete individually to apply for our homestay program. Here, students have an opportunity to specify preferences so that our Housing Team can match them with appropriate families.

Residence Information

Residence Accommodations: Located just steps away from the classrooms, each residence suite consists of two private bedrooms, each furnished with a double bed, dresser, and desk with a work area. The suite also includes a kitchenette equipped with a microwave, full-size refrigerator, sink, storage, table, and chairs. Additionally, each suite features a three-piece washroom, satellite TV, and internet access.



Weather and Packing List

Summer temperatures can be hot and humid and days are usually in the 20°-30°C range while nights tend to average in the 10°C range. Lightweight casual clothing with a hat and lots of sunscreen when outside is recommended. In extreme cases, temperatures can approach 40°C in the summer months.

Note, a reusable water bottle will be provided to students at orientation.

Public Transportation

The Niagara Region offers a safe public transportation system to all its residents. The majority of our students travel via public transportation to campus, the grocery store, traveling to different cities within Niagara Region, etc. Students will have a Transit Pass for the duration of their stay with us. Students can use the Transit App for transit/busing directions (<https://transitapp.com/>). Bus passes will be provided to students on arrival.

City of Welland Overview

The City of Welland is located in the heart of the Niagara Peninsula, south of Lake Ontario and north of Lake Erie. Via highway, Welland is approximately seventy-five minutes from Toronto and within thirty minutes of Buffalo, New York. Welland is bounded by the City of Thorold and the Town of Pelham to the north, the City of Port Colborne to the south, the Township of Wainfleet to west and the Cities of Niagara Falls and Fort Erie to the east.

Welland is one of Canada's genuinely authentic recreational canal cities, with the Welland Recreational Canal running through the downtown core. Welland is known for scenic cycling paths

and the Welland International Flatwater Centre (WIFC). Welland is Niagara's sport-tourism destination.

Things to See and Do in Niagara

Walking and Hiking Trails

Niagara has many walking and hiking trails that offer unique features in natural settings. We encourage students to get outside, get active and explore the natural beauty of Niagara. A list of walking and hiking trails in Niagara is included here:

Niagara Falls

Niagara Falls, Ontario, is a Canadian city at the famous waterfalls of the same name, linked with the U.S. by the Rainbow Bridge. Its site on the Niagara River's western shore overlooks the Horseshoe Falls, the cascades' most expansive section. Elevators take visitors to a lower, wetter vantage point behind the falls. A cliffside park features a promenade alongside 520-ft.-high Skylon Tower with an observation deck. There is so much fun to be had at Niagara Falls including attractions, rides, casinos, arcades, golf, spas, shopping, waterparks, etc. Students will have the opportunity to visit Niagara Falls as part of the ELCP program.

Old Town Niagara-on-the-Lake

Old Town Niagara-on-the-Lake is one of Canada's most historic and picturesque towns! Each year millions of people from around the world travel here to experience the Town's unique charm and historic sites, including Fort George and Brock's Monument; period-restored heritage homes, top-flight golf courses, breath-taking parks and gardens, as well as over 30 wineries and countless vineyards, many of which produce Niagara's world-class ice wine. Students will have the opportunity to visit Old Town Niagara-on-the-Lake as part of the ELCP program.

Shopping – Outlet Collection at Niagara

Located in the beautiful Niagara region, minutes from Niagara College's Daniel J. Patterson Campus in Niagara-on-the-Lake, this refreshing new outlet concept combines brand name fashion and lifestyle retailers—all at outlet prices you can't resist! Canadian Cultural Dos and Don'ts

Tipping

The tipping culture in Canada features customary tip amounts for different services. Common tipping practices include tipping restaurants, bars, hotels, taxi services, train assistants, and other personal services. The standard tipping percentage in Canada is 15 to 20 percent for servers and a dollar a drink for bartenders. Baristas usually feature a jar where throwing in a few coins is customary. The amount is more variable among cab drivers. When tipping, use the local currency for easy calculations and exchange. There's no standard tipping policy in Canada, so you can give as much as you want if the business permits it. Most tippers consider factors such as exceptional service, menu prices, and payment options. Tipping practices and amounts also vary depending on the type of establishment.

Greetings and Communication Styles

Canadian greetings are generally friendly and casual, often involving a handshake, smile, and direct eye contact. Canadians value politeness and may use "please" and "thank you" frequently. Canadians are known for their "sorry" culture, where saying sorry is a common expression of politeness, even for minor situations. Don't be surprised if you hear "sorry" frequently, as it's often used as a form of courtesy and not necessarily an admission of fault. It's common to address people by their first names in informal settings, but using titles and last names is more appropriate in formal or professional contexts. In social settings, Canadians are generally open to discussing a wide range of topics, such as weather, sports, hobbies, travel, and current events. However, it's best to avoid controversial subjects like politics, religion, and personal finances unless the topic is broached by others.

Cultural Diversity and Sensitivity

Canada is a culturally diverse nation, with people from various backgrounds and traditions. Being open-minded, respectful, and curious about different cultures is highly appreciated. Be sensitive to cultural differences and avoid making assumptions about someone's background or beliefs. Respect religious practices and dietary restrictions when sharing meals or participating in events.

Punctuality

Canadians generally value punctuality and expect others to be on time for appointments, meetings, and social gatherings. Arriving a few minutes early is considered polite and shows respect for others' time.

Personal Space

Canadians value personal space, and it's essential to respect the comfort zone of others. Maintain an appropriate distance during conversations and be mindful of body language to avoid making others feel uncomfortable.

Airport Arrival – What to Expect

We prioritize delivering the best experience for our students from the moment they arrive in Canada, providing a welcoming and supportive environment to ensure our students feel safe. **Group** airport transportation will be provided to and from Toronto Pearson Airport. Niagara College Student Assistants will greet students with an NC sign/banner right outside of the international arrivals' doors and will walk together with the students to the bus. From there, students will be driven back to Welland, where they will either be met by their homestay families on campus or dropped off individually to their homestays (depending on arrival flight time).

Guard.me Insurance Overview

Guard.me is a solutions-focused health and wellness insurance provider for NC's international students. They provide a dedicated team who understands the exciting journey international students are on, and how an unexpected medical bill or mental health concern can stop it. No matter the situation, they will assist in looking for solutions. Our health and wellness partner empowers students to safely travel the world to enrich their lives through international study. NC believes everyone should feel safe, supported, and cared for during their time abroad. All ELCP students will be covered by Guard.me insurance during their time at NC. Appendix B – GCTC Contract Letter Overview

The Contract Letter outlines the terms that we have agreed upon with respect to service of program delivery, medical insurance, homestay, airport transfer, cultural and social activities, orientation and graduation, statement of participation and bus pass, as well as any reporting requirements. It will also provide a summary of the Financial and Delivery Schedule and will have similar information to the invoice. It is different than the MOU, in that it addresses the specific details for a specific program for a specific term.

Appendix C – Other Documents

Underage Activities Consent Form: Only required for students under 18 years of age. Must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian for underage students to be able to participate in social events.

Custodianship Declaration: Only required for students under 18 years of age. Proves the government of Canada that suitable arrangements have been made for the care and support for minor children who travel to the country to study. Must be completed and sent to NC for signing and notarization prior to travel.

Media Waiver Clearance Form: Grants NC permission to photograph and/or record students off campus. Optional for all students but students under 18 years of age also require a parent/guardian signature if they agree to being photographed.

Student Photos: To be used for Student Identification (ID) cards. These cards grant students access to printing and photocopying and other NC student services. Providing student photos ahead of time will expedite the process and students will have ID cards on arrival. Please find acceptable photo submission guidelines below:

- Photo is in colour, portrait (passport) style and centered
- Photo is well lit, clear and in-focus
- Photo is of only you (e.g.: No dogs, people, kites, unicorns or other distractions should be visible in the background)
- Photo is in a JPG or JPEG file format with a minimum size of 360px wide by 480px high

Dietary Restrictions: Needed ahead of time for orientation and graduation celebrations.

Underage Student: Checklist for Social Activities Participation

CUSTODIANSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Niagara College welcomes students who are high school graduates from around the world to study at our college. We recognize that occasionally students under the age of 18 have a high school graduation diploma and hope to continue their studies at Niagara College. As required by Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC), students under 18 years of age are required to submit custodianship documents with their study permit application. Niagara College can help facilitate custodial documentation for international students attending Niagara College under the age of 18, providing that the student and their parents agree to the following conditions.

1. The student must pre-arrange airport pickup and inform Niagara College with detailed arrival (flight) information at least 14 days prior to the arrival date.
2. The student must attend the International Student Orientation.
3. The student must attend the following meetings:
 - a. Meet with your custodian (director of the International Department)
 - b. Meet with International Student Advisor throughout the term as requested
 - c. Meet with Housing Coordinator
4. The student must live in a Niagara College arranged homestay or on-campus Residence.
5. The student must keep their contact information (address and phone numbers) updated.
6. The student must get any move approved by the Housing Coordinator.
7. The student must schedule a meeting with the Custodian in the event that the student wants to withdraw / transfer.
8. The student / parents must arrange for a new custodianship in the event of withdraw / transfer.
9. The student must maintain satisfactory attendance in all classes.

- **A Drugstore or Pharmacy** can help you find solutions for minor health issues without seeing a doctor.
